Sports Premium Statement of use 2013-2014 And proposed use of allocation in 2014-2015

As a school we have always placed a great emphasis on PE and are proud of our overall provision, commitment to improving facilities and success in competitive events over the past few years.

During 2013-2014 Isaac Newton Primary School was allocated over £9,000 to improve the quality and breadth of PE within the school. This has been used in partnership with Inspire+ (a local sports charity) in order to:

- 1. Procure the services of specialist PE teachers and coaches to develop the provision within school.
- 2. Compete in tournaments so that children can experience a range of competition throughout years 3-6.
- 3. Enhance extra curricular activity in the form of clubs
- 4. To enhance the facilities in school buying equipment and enhancing outside sports areas.
- 5. Present inspiring assemblies focusing on healthy lifestyles and specific values that the school wishes to develop especially within sports
- 6. Meet amateur and professional sportspeople
- 7. Providing places on trips/residentials where pupils participate in adventurous activities
- 8. Increasing the range of sports in which pupils participate (climbing, badminton)

The results of this investment were:

- Pupils received specialist training in sports that would otherwise be impossible to provide
- Children were able to participate in an increased range of sports clubs
- Children attended an increased number of competitive sporting events/tournaments
- Children were given aspirations and positive role models Paralympic table tennis team, playing tennis at the Houses of Parliament and meeting David Cameron, assemblies focusing on the personal qualities needed in sport
- The quality of equipment was improved footballs and posts, rebound nets etc were purchased
- Staff were given the opportunity to observe specialists delivering lessons
