

Sports Premium
Statement of use 2016-2017
And proposed use of allocation in 2017-2018

As a school we have always placed a great emphasis on PE and are proud of our overall provision, commitment to improving facilities and success in competitive events over the past few years.

During 2016-2017 Isaac Newton Primary School was allocated over £10,000 to improve the quality and breadth of PE within the school. This has been used in partnership with Inspire+ (a local sports charity) in order to:

1. Procure the services of specialist PE teachers and coaches in order to develop the provision within school (£1000 tennis, positive futures)
2. Utilise Real PE scheme of work and observe specialist teachers over various groups (£500 scheme)
3. Compete in tournaments so that children can experience a range of competition throughout years 2-6 (£1000)
4. Enhance extra-curricular activity in the form of clubs (£2000 within contracts of staff)
5. To enhance the facilities in school – buying equipment and enhancing outside sports areas (£1000)
6. Provide opportunities that raise awareness of healthy lifestyles and specific values that the school wishes to develop – especially within sports (Roots t school £500)
7. Provide places on trips/residentials where pupils participate in adventurous activities (£500 day at PGL)
8. Improve links with external clubs to increase the range of sports in which pupils participate (Within tennis coaching budget)
9. Meet professional or high performing sports people to inspire pupils (Inspire+ £4500)
10. Ensure that we can attend sporting fixtures for teams of different levels by hiring minibuses (£1000)
11. Attend large sporting events such as the mini Olympics (within Inspire+ budget)

The results of this investment were:

- Pupils received specialist training in sports that would otherwise be impossible to provide (tennis, climbing, badminton, PGL...)
- Children were able to participate in an increased range of sports clubs

- Children attended an increased number of competitive sporting events/tournaments
- Children were given aspirations and positive role models – Paralympian Sam Ruddock, Olympian Sophie Allen, Ben Smith (401 Marathon), Sarah Outen homecoming.
- Pupils in Year 5 were given the opportunity to take part in outdoor adventurous activities, prior to the Year 6 residential trip
- Links with external clubs have increased, allowing children to increase their participation
- Staff were given the opportunity to observe specialists delivering lessons and take part in full staff training sessions. This has increased and upskilled teachers in delivering high quality PE lessons
- School achieved the Gold School Games award for the third successive year!

Proposed Use of the Sports Premium 2017-2018

In 2017-2018 Isaac Newton School will again receive over £10,000 through the sports premium and may receive up to £19,000 should the government intentions be maintained. This will be used in partnership with in order to:

1. Procure the services of specialist PE teachers and coaches to develop the provision within school.
2. Compete in tournaments so that children can experience a range of competition throughout years 3-6.
3. Enhance extra-curricular activity in the form of clubs
4. To enhance the facilities in school - buying equipment and enhancing outside sports areas, renewing playground markings and investing in hall markings.
5. Present inspiring assemblies focusing on healthy lifestyles and specific values that the school wishes to develop – especially within sports
6. Meet amateur and professional sportspeople
7. Provide places on trips where pupils participate in adventurous activities
8. Increase the range of sports in which pupils participate (gymnastics)
9. Train teachers, increasing their understanding of PE and the quality of the provision within the school through use of Real Gym.
10. Allow access to sports that are outside the boundaries of the provision within school (such as rock climbing)
11. Have a one day visit to an outdoor adventurous activities camp for pupils in year 5 – increasing familiarity prior to signing up for the residential visit.
12. Provide transport for pupils to tournaments
13. Create a bespoke package of provision with Inspire+
