Remember they are decorated with a picture of the person and show off their wealth.



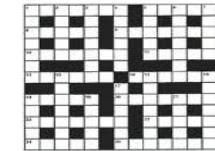
Research what ancient Egyptian homes looked like, then show in pictures, words or a model.
