School Rules

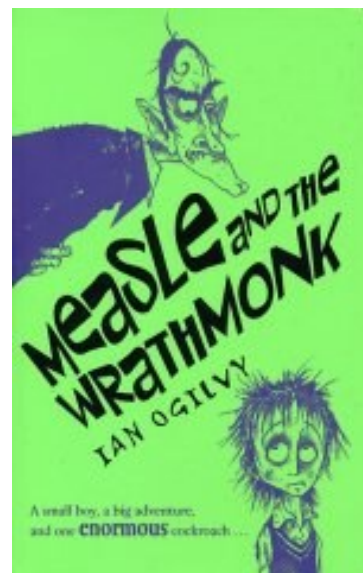
Here are the new school rules which have been created by School Council. What do you think?
