Information for parents and carers on suspected COVID-19 (coronavirus) in a child

WHEN TO SUSPECT COVID-19 IN YOUR CHILD:

if they develop symptoms of a new continuous cough and/or high temperature and/or a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

Do not send your child to school or childcare setting. Inform the setting through absence reporting If your child develops symptoms at the childcare setting, they will be separated from others, and will **be sent home**

If your child (or anyone in your household) has symptoms they must arrange a test **as soon as possible** and isolate at home for **10 days** from date of onset of symptoms (or until they receive a negative result). Everyone else in the household who does not have symptoms must isolate at home for 14 days (or until the symptomatic household member receives a negative result)

Arrange for a coronavirus test for anyone in your household with symptoms either online via **www.nhs.uk/coronavirus** or call NHS testing line on 119. The test must be done within **five days** of when symptoms start. Ensure you know who to contact with the results in the school/childcare setting if the results are received outside usual working hours

You will be offered a test at your closest drive-through centre. This is the quickest option.

A parent or carer will need to perform the test on children under 12 years old. If you don't drive, you can request a home test kit. **Do not** get a taxi or public transport to the test centre

Result of test (you will receive this by email or text message)

NEGATIVE

Child/staff member can return to setting once well, unless they are a contact of a case, when they will need to complete 14 days self-isolation

If your child is identified as having been in contact with a confirmed case, they will need to self-isolate for 14 days, even if they have had a negative test result. If they develop symptoms, they should isolate for 10 days from onset of symptoms, arrange testing and follow the flowchart above

For medical advice call NHS 111, or in an emergency call 999

POSITIVE

Inform the school or childcare setting as soon as possible even if outside opening hours. The child's close contacts within the school will be advised to self-isolate for 14 days

Ensure the child who has tested positive completes the 10 day isolation period (from date of onset of symptom)*. Household members without symptoms should complete 14 days isolation

NHS Test & Trace will send you a text or email alert or call you with instructions of how to share details of people with whom you have had close, recent contact and places you have visited

*If the child is a confirmed case they can return to the childcare setting/school after 10 days. If they still have a temperature, diarrhoea or are being sick they should wait until 48 hours after these symptoms stop. If the child does not develop symptoms, but lives in a household with someone who has tested positive, they can return to setting after completing 14 days self-isolation at home

Covid Symptoms

Attached to this newsletter is a useful diagram to support you taking the right steps if you think that your child has Covid-19 symptoms. You will also see below, a diagram describing what to do if someone in your family gets sick and has a positive test.

Please ensure that you phone the school immediately to let us know if your child is displaying symptoms. Children should NOT attend school if this is the case.

We will then ask that you take a test as soon as possible and let us know the outcome once you receive it.

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Another letter should have gone home with your child this • week regarding downloading the E-Schools app. This app will help us to ensure that we can communicate messages to you quickly, for example, if we need to close a class. It will also help us to keep you up-to-date with changes within •

Please can we ask all Parents/Carers to download the app on their smartphone or device as soon as possible. Thank you to all those parents who have already done so- we will be looking to get the app up running over the next few weeks.

If you have any problems with the app or setting up your account then please email enquiries@isaacnewton-cit.co.uk. Mr Hearn will then be able to support you with this. If you have siblings in school then you will need to use the 'add account' section of the app for each child. Once set up you can then switch between children in the app.

TikTok

We have been made aware of an inappropriate video which is currently circulating on TikTok. Despite the age restrictions for the platform meaning that children under 13 years cannot legally have an account we are aware that some children do access it regularly.

Please check your children's devices and ensure you speak to them about what they should do if they come across inappropriate content or videos that worry/scare them.

School would advise that no child under 13 years old has access to TikTok.

Late Arrivals

If you arrive late and the front gate is shut or there is no adult at your child's entrance/ exit door then please bring your child to the school office- do not under any circumstances enter the school building by yourself. We appreciate that sometimes things can happen and you can be delayed so if you think that you may be late either call or come to the school office and we will be able to direct you.

Social Distancing Around School

Please can we ask Parents/Carers to ensure that they sticking to the 2m social distancing rule when on or around the school site. To make this easier we have created a one way system around school. Please ensure that this is followedparticularly around the basketball court area. We will be putting a ramp up on the steps and also a path across the field very shortly to make this more accessible. If you are unsure about how our one way system works then please speak to a member of staff.

There are a number of other things that you can also do to help us with ensuring social distancing:

- Please arrive at the correct time slot. Many parents are arriving too early at the end of the day and this causes congestion, particularly by the basketball court
- If you have children in classes 8, 11, 12, 13 or 14 then please try and collect these children first before moving to the other side of the school to collect siblings. This will help with the flow of traffic.
- Ensure that no more than one Parent/Carer enters the school site.
- If your child is old enough then consider letting them walk in and out of school by themselves. If you are not comfortable with this then alternately they could enter and leave the classroom by themselves and then you can arrange to meet them on or near to the school site. This will help us to avoid congestion outside of classrooms (particularly by the basketball courts). Please inform the office or your child's teacher if you would like them to do either of the above and make sure that you continue to follow to our agreed timing.
