


# The school day for Reception children begins at 08:50am and ends at 3.20pm.

(A breakfast club is available if you wish to leave your child at school earlier than this.)

The children will normally line up on the KS1 Playground and the Class Teacher will collect them.

If you arrive late to school or you need to collect your child early you will need to go to the office at the front of school.



They will put reading folders in their tray and drink bottles and lunch boxes (if having packed lunches)

into baskets.



Reading folders are £4.00 from the school office.



Children will need to hang their coats, p.e bags and spare clothing onto their peg.



The children find own name on table and place on the self-registration board.

### **Arrival Routines.**

The children may then choose from a range of 'morning activities' in class. (As the year progresses the children carry out a carousel of morning activities –handwriting, name writing, reading, news etc.)










# Starting in Reception A Typical Day in Reception Phonics Bug

As the children start to learn the first sets of phonemes they begin to read simple words through sound talk and practise writing or making words using magnetic letters.






The children will have a daily Maths session.


In Reception we use Numicon to introduce the children to counting, addition, ordering and subtracting numbers. We can even use Numicon for weighing!















Our maths activities are very practical in Reception. We play lots of games in a group with an adult to reinforce counting, addition, subtraction, pattern, matching and sorting.

### **Dinner Time**

All the children in the Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a hot dinner.

A Menu will be sent out for each Half Term. You will have a choice from three options each day and the slip will need to be returned to school.

If you do not send your form in your child will be given Option 1.



Dinner menus for September will be given out in July.

If you wish you can send a packed lunch for your child.



#### P.E Kit

Children in the Reception will need a P.E. kit.

This should include a pair of **shorts**, **a t-shirt and a pair of plimsolls** in a small P.E bag.

PE lessons usually take place on a **Wednesday morning** but it is best to keep P.E. kits in school at all times and take home each half term to wash. Children should not wear earrings to school on P.E Days.

- •Snack (fruit/vegetables) is available for all the children in the Foundation Stage, such as apples, bananas, pears, carrots, tomatoes, cucumbers and strawberries.
- •Children under 5 and those children eligible for Free school meals will be entitled to a free carton of milk.
- •You may order milk for your child once they are 5 under the Cool Milk scheme! (A leaflet/form is enclosed)
- •A school water bottle is available and costs £2.50 -Please fill with water only.

Please keep us informed of any special dietary requirements, food allergies or food intolerance.

In September we will invite you to sign up for 2Build a Profile so that we can email you regular updates of what your child has been learning in school.


### 2Build a Profile will shortly be changing its name to Evidence Me!







# **Development Matters and The Early Years Foundation Stage**



In the Summer term we will assess your child against the Early Learning Goals in each area of learning. They will be given a 1,2 or 3 for each area. Your child will have a 2 if they have met the expected level for the end of Reception. A 1 if they are emerging in that level and have not quite met the levels expected for a Reception child and a 3 if they have exceeded the level of development for a Reception child.

# Gaining a Full Picture of Your Child's Development

We need your help to gain a full and true picture of your child's abilities. Learning does not end when the child walks out of the school doors.

If you notice any new skills or activities your child is involved in we would like to know.

You can share home learning with us on our Class Padlet or through 2Build a Profile.



- Singing number rhymes.








- Practise doing up zips and buttons.






## Attendance at Isaac Newton



- The most important thing for us is that your child likes coming to school and feels safe.
