Playground Leaders

This week we have had Mike Hale from Inspire+ into school to work with some of our Year 6 children. They have been trained as playground leaders and will run games and activities on our school playground for groups of children. Mike showed them a number of games and activities which we hope will encourage all pupils to become more physically active during their break times. As a school we are working hard to ensure that all children are active for at least 30 minutes a day- in line with the Government's Active 30:30 initiative.

School Shoes

Please can we remind parents that school shoes should be plain black (with black soles), without logos. If boots are worn then these should also be plain black. If children need to wear different footwear (for reasons such as medical issues) then please ensure that their class teacher is informed, in writing, as to why this is the case.

Lateness

This term we will be having a push to ensure that all children are arriving at school in time to begin the school day with the rest of their class. When a child arrives late at school, they miss valuable learning time. This is something that we must ensure does not happen. The table below shows the way in which lateness can add up over time to make a huge difference to the amount of time that children are spending at school. We teach essential skills during the first session each morning and any lateness can make a massive difference to pupils' progress. We welcome children into school at 8:50am each day. Children are considered to be late if they arrive after 9:00am.

Number of minutes late a	Number of days missed a year!
5	1 and a half days
10	2 and three quarter days
15	4 and a quarter days
20	5 and three quarter days
25	7 days
30	8 and a half days

This is based on children spending 5 hours and 20 minutes in class each day.

Primary Sports Games Mark

This week we were joined in assembly by Mr Terry Plumb from the Priory Ruskin Academy in Grantham. As part of Mr Plumb's role as School Games Organiser, he supports schools in applying for the School Games Mark. Mr Plumb presented our Bronze Ambassadors with the award. This means that the school has now been awarded gold for four years in a row! We will now be looking to achieve the platinum award this academic year, making us only the second school in the area to do this! A huge well done to our PE team, especially Mrs Atter who has spent lots of time preparing our application and gathering all the evidence required!
