This was compounded by the additional challenges faced as families and staff travel to and from the school.

Thank you to all of those people who shared the news via social media and a special thanks to Mrs Haddock who does an incredible job to keep us running and was at school to ensure that anybody who arrived could return home safely.

Mon 14 th May	Grammar test followed by: Spelling Test
Tuesday 15 th May	Reading test
Weds 16 th May	Maths Paper 1 (arithmetic) followed by Maths Paper 2 (reasoning)
Thurs 17 th May	Maths Paper 3 (reasoning)

We do not want the pupils to become stressed or disenchanted with school during the build-up. As such we have explained that we do not mind how each pupil does so long as they try their hardest. The SATs are important as they are used to gauge future progress, especially in Year 11 (GCSE year). As such doing well now is a firm foundation for the future.
