It has been another exceptionally busy week here at Isaac Newton. The pupils are continuing to excel and we are delighted with the attitudes being demonstrated by children throughout the school.

We welcomed Mr Booth, a specialist in computing from our own Community Inclusive Trust, to school on Tuesday. Mr Booth held E-Safety lessons for each of the classes from Year 1 to Year 6 in order to ensure that pupils have an up to date knowledge of the ways in which to stay safe online. He was really impressed with the pupils' knowledge and we were delighted with the sessions that he provided. E-safety is an extremely important aspect of school life. They won all of their matches on the way to the final of the competition where they were narrowly beaten. A huge congratulations to all pupils who represented the school in these fixtures.
